EXTRACT OF MINUTES of a regular public meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Chicago Park District held at the Chicago Park District Administration Building, 4830 S. Western Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, in said Park District at 11:30 a.m., on the 14th day of February, 2024.

* * *

The meeting was called to order by the President, and upon the roll being called, Myetie H. Hamilton, the President, and the following Commissioners were physically present at said location: President Hamilton, Vice President Valle, Commissioners Netzky, Munoz, Telli, and Walker.

The following Commissioners were allowed by a majority of the members of the Board of Commissioners in accordance with and to the extent allowed by rules adopted by the Board of Commissioners to attend the meeting by video or audio conference: None

No Commissioner was not permitted to attend the meeting by video or audio conference.

The following Commissioners were absent and did not participate in the meeting in any manner or to any extent whatsoever: <u>None.</u>

The President announced that in view of the need to finance the acquisition, construction, improvement and expansion of recreational facilities of the District to provide for recreational programs for persons with disabilities, the Board of Commissioners would consider the adoption of an ordinance authorizing the issuance of General Obligation Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source) and directing the publication of a notice setting forth the determination of the Board to issue such bonds.

Whereupon an official of the District presented and the Secretary read by title an ordinance as follows, a copy of which was provided to each Commissioner prior to said meeting and to everyone in attendance at said meeting who requested a copy:

NOTICE OF INTENT TO ISSUE BONDS AND RIGHT TO FILE PETITION

Notice is hereby given that pursuant to an ordinance adopted on the 14th day of February, 2024 (the "Ordinance"), the Chicago Park District (the "District"), intends to issue General Obligation Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source) (the "Bonds") in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$11,000,000 for the purpose of financing the acquisition, construction, improvement and expansion of recreational facilities of the District to provide for recreational programs for persons with disabilities as authorized in Section 7.06 of the Chicago Park District Act, as amended (the "Act"). The Bonds will be payable from the tax receipts derived by the District from the annual tax levied by the District pursuant to Section 7.06(c) of the Act, or from any successor or replacement tax as may be hereafter enacted. If such revenue source is insufficient to pay the Bonds, ad valorem property taxes upon all taxable property in the District without limitation as to rate or amount are authorized to be extended to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds. A complete copy of the Ordinance follows this notice.

Notice is hereby further given that a petition signed by 119,036 or more electors of the District, said number of electors being equal to the greater of (i) 7.5% of the number of registered voters in the District or (ii) 200 of those registered voters or 15% of those registered voters, whichever is less, may be submitted to the Secretary of the Board of Commissioners of the District (the "Secretary") within thirty (30) days of publication of this notice and the Ordinance asking that the question of the issuance of the Bonds be submitted to referendum. If such petition is filed with the Secretary within thirty (30) days after the date of publication of this notice, an election on the proposition to issue said bonds shall be held on the 5th day of November, 2024. The Circuit Court may declare that an emergency referendum should be held prior to said election date pursuant to the provisions of Section 2A-1.4 of the Election Code of the State of Illinois, as amended. If no such petition is filed within said thirty (30) day period, then the District shall thereafter be authorized to issue the Bonds.

Sarah Gelder Secretary, Board of Commissioners Chicago Park District ORDINANCE authorizing the issuance of General Obligation Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source) of the Chicago Park District in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$11,000,000 pursuant to the Local Government Debt Reform Act of the State of Illinois, as amended, for the purpose of financing the acquisition, construction, improvement and expansion of recreational facilities of the District to provide for recreational programs for persons with disabilities.

WHEREAS, the Chicago Park District (the "District"), is a duly organized and existing park district created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois, and is now operating under the provisions of the Chicago Park District Act, as amended (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the District (the "Board") has determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the best interests of the District to finance the acquisition, construction, improvement and expansion of recreational facilities of the District to provide for recreational programs for persons with disabilities as authorized in Section 7.06 of the Act (the "Project"), all in accordance with the preliminary estimate of cost heretofore approved by the Board and now on file in the office of the Secretary of the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Board has further determined the estimated cost of the Project, including legal, financial, bond discount, capitalized interest, printing and publication costs and other expenses, to be not less than \$11,000,000, and there are insufficient funds on hand and lawfully available to pay such costs; and

WHEREAS, the Board has further determined that it is advisable and necessary that the Project be undertaken and, in order to raise the funds required to pay such costs, that the District borrow an amount not to exceed \$11,000,000 and, in evidence thereof, issue General Obligation Bonds (Alternate Revenue Source) in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$11,000,000 (the "Bonds"), in accordance with the provisions of Section 15 of the Local Government Debt Reform Act of the State of Illinois, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the principal of and interest on the Bonds will be payable from the tax receipts derived by the District from the annual tax levied by the District pursuant to Section 7.06(c) of the Act, or from any successor or replacement tax as may be hereafter enacted (the "Pledged Revenues"); and

WHEREAS, if the Pledged Revenues are insufficient to pay the Bonds, ad valorem property taxes upon all taxable property in the District without limitation as to rate or amount are authorized to be extended to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds:

Now, Therefore, Be It and It Is Hereby Ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Chicago Park District, as follows:

Section 1. Incorporation of Preambles. The Board hereby finds that all of the recitals contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are full, true and correct and does incorporate them into this Ordinance by this reference.

Section 2. Determination to Issue Bonds. It is necessary and in the best interests of the District to undertake the Project and the Bonds are hereby authorized to be issued and sold for that purpose.

Section 3. Publication. This Ordinance, together with a notice in the statutory form, shall be published in the Chicago Sun-Times, the same being a newspaper of general circulation in the District, and if no petition, signed by 119,036 electors, the same being equal to the greater of (i) 7.5% of the number of registered voters in the District or (ii) 200 of those registered voters or 15% of those registered voters, whichever is less, asking that the issuance of the Bonds be submitted to referendum, is filed with the Secretary of the Board within thirty (30) days after the date of the publication of this Ordinance and said notice, then the Bonds shall be authorized to be issued.

Section 4. Additional Ordinances. The Board may from time to time in the future adopt additional ordinances or proceedings supplementing or amending this Ordinance. If no petition meeting the requirements of applicable law is filed during the petition period hereinabove referred to, then the Board may adopt additional ordinances or proceedings supplementing or amending this Ordinance providing for the issuance and sale of the Bonds and prescribing all the details of the Bonds, so long as the maximum amount of the Bonds as set forth in this Ordinance is not exceeded and there is no material change in the Project or the purposes described herein. Such additional ordinances or proceedings shall in all instances become effective immediately without publication or posting or any further act or requirement. This Ordinance, together with such additional ordinances or proceedings, shall constitute complete authority for the issuance of the Bonds under applicable law.

Section 5. Severability. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.
